### Webinars

Brian Koper is scheduled to present on FEMA's newly published Applied Approaches document on non-levee embankments on March 16<sup>th</sup>.

We discussed options for the next webinar (April – June timeframe).

### National Water Model

Trey Flower with NOAA has agreed to present with Dave presenting on Maryland's related pilot project. We had targeted June – however the NOAA is unavailable in June. We have scheduled a call next week to discuss timing.

### Future Conditions Mapping

Pew conducted a webinar this week on an analysis of state efforts to incorporate climate change into future conditions flood hazard mapping. Five states were highlighted as best practices. It would be nice to highlight these and include a specific example. Brooke indicated she would check with Mile High staff regarding the landuse future conditions mapping the district includes in their mapping efforts. ASFPM has long supported future conditions mapping associated with landuse/growth of development. Climate change has increased the discussion on future conditions mapping.

### Historic Flood Data

Maryland is in the process of developing outreach to communities related to stormwater/flooding issues. In the process MD staff discovered a NOAA dataset related to historic flooding dating back to the 1950s. The data are geospatial and can be downloaded for each year so that statewide maps of historic flooding can be developed. Two Maryland counties are using the data for their hazard mitigation plans. MD is including this in their outreach so that the other 22 counties in the state are aware of these data.

MD provided a link to the site and some screen captures of the maps MD has developed with the geospatial datasets.
