

Cooperating Technical Partners – ASFPM CTP Subcommittee Monthly Call – March 9, 2026

CTP virtual conversation

The CTP virtual conversation was held on January 20th at noon CST. Brooke has provided a summary of one of the breakout sessions. Joanna indicated that AI was used to provide the content of the webinar. However, it did not provide a summary of the breakout sessions. It was agreed that we would pull together the summaries of the breakout session would focus on what was discussed and not on who was in the breakout sessions.

Joanna went to the sharepoint site and was able to download the contact information for ctps that use the sharepoint site. This can be consolidated with the listing of CTPs that was listing of CTPs prepared for the virtual meeting.

- One item of note is a comment in Brooks breakout summary. Participants asked whether ASFPM could compile data on:
 - How many CTP programs have had to pause or stop work, and
 - How many positions have been lost or are at risk due to grant uncertainty.

Alan provided a draft set of questions for the flash survey. The group thought the first four questions were the content of interest plus an open-ended question for people to provide some additional information.

Joanna is working on a summary.

We determined that the next session would be in April – April 20th from noon to 1 pm CDT. We would again have one of the policy team provide an update on FEMA – specifically is a NOFO for mapping is forthcoming. Then group discussion with focus on one thing you (CTPs) are doing well.

Brooke indicated that she had learned from their region that the region will no longer be processing CLOMRs.

CTP conversation at the Milw conference

The CTP conversation has been moved to coincide with the afternoon committee co-chairs meetings. Brooke indicated that since they do not have a lot of topics for the M&ES meeting that she and Glenn thought it would be good to include the CTP conversation with the committee meeting. Alan will check with the conference committee to see how difficult it will be to change the program. M&ES meeting

We discussed that it might be useful to have a presentation on Atlas 14. An option would be to have Fathom present on their methodology and processes. Access to their data requires a subscription. The

resolution of the DEM data is important related to the accuracy. If Rich Sacbibit is attending he may be able to speak about the new FEMA Data Archive site,

CTP webinar

We had a poll asking CTP virtual conversation attendees to vote on preferences for CTP webinars. Artificial Intelligence impact on Mapping got the most votes, Future of Flood Risk Data (or other mapping effort) 2nd, and 2D modeling outreach 3rd.

Brooke indicated that the MHFD is testing the use of AI to provide a way to people to find things easily in a pdf Flood Hazard Area Delineation document. Depending of the results that could be a portion of a webinar.
